Life-Sharing Lesson 1 The Light Brings Peace Luke 2:8-20

- 1. What does it mean to you to have peace between two parties?
- 2. Do you think that God is angry with the world? Why or why not?

Luke 2:8-20 (NIV)

- ⁸ And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people.
- ¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord.
- This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."
- Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests." ¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." ¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them.
- ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart.
- The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

10. What's most likely going to rob you of your peace during the Christmas season? How can you give that over to God?
11. The shepherds were eager to tell others about the birth of Jesus. What extra step are you willing to take to tell the good news about Jesus to others this Christmas? Who could you invite to either the Christmas Sunday or Christmas Eve service?

Life-Sharing Lesson 2 The Light Brings Joy Matthew 2:1-12

- 1. What comes to mind when you hear the word joy?
- 2. What about Christmas brings you the most joy?

Matthew 2:1-12 (NIV)

- ¹ After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem ² and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him."
- ³ When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him.
- ⁴ When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵ "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written:
- ⁶ "'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the shepherd of my people Israel.'"
- ⁷ Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared.
- ⁸ He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and make a careful search for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him." ⁹ After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was.
- When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. ¹¹ On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh.
- ¹² And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.
